EMPLOYMENT OF CHILDREN AND YOUNG PERSONS

THE LAW SAYS

Children are not allowed to work:

- during school hours on school days;
- in any factory or industrial undertaking;
- in a cinema, theatre, discotheque, dance hall or nightclub, except where the performance is entirely given by children;
- selling or delivering alcohol, except in sealed containers;
- delivering milk;
- delivering fuel oils;
- in a commercial kitchen;
- collecting or sorting refuse;
- in any work which is more than three metres above ground level or, if inside, more than three metres above floor level;
- in any work involving harmful exposure to physical, biological or chemical agents;
- collecting money or selling or canvassing door to door except under the supervision of an adult;
- in any work involving exposure to adult material or in situations which are for this reason unsuitable for children;
- in telephone sales;
- in any slaughterhouse or butcher's shop;
- as an attendant or assistant in a fairground or amusement arcade or any other similar premises;
- in the personal care of residents of any residential care home or nursing home;
- in street trading.
